First Steps for Students in Academic Difficulty

- **Talk to someone if a health or mental health issue is getting in the way of your performance**, contact Student Health Services 737-9355 and/or Counseling and Psychological Services (541) 737-2131 for assistance right away.
- **Talk with your graduate teaching assistant or professor.** They can suggest strategies for succeeding in their course.
- **Email or talk to your advisor.** Make sure they are aware of your situation so they can discuss options including getting help or changes in coursework. The last day to S/U or withdraw from a course is the Friday of week seven each term. You cannot S/U courses for your major so you should talk options with your advisor before week seven.
- **Visit the Academic Success Center or one of the other academic support programs and centers** listed below for general studying and success assistance.
- **Use the academic, tutoring, and study group resources** on the back of this document for help with specific courses.
- **Talk to Counseling and Psychological Services about text anxiety** (541) 737-2131.

Academic Success Center (ASC) - Assistance with General Study Skills

Academic Success Center (ASC) - 102 Waldo Hall, 737-2272, <http://success.oregonstate.edu> supports all OSU students through information and referral, courses, academic coaches and peer lead study tables (see the back of this document). The ASC can help with general study skills in the following ways:

- **Meet with an Academic Coach** about improving your grades, doing better in tests, or managing your time. Call the Academic Success Center at 737-2272 to have an individual consultation.

Educational Opportunity Program (EOP) - Assistance for Nontraditional Students

Education Opportunities Program (EOP), 337 Waldo Hall, 737-3628, <http://oregonstate.edu/dept/eop/> works with nontraditional students including students of color, older than average students, students with disabilities, single parents, low-income, and rurally isolated students. Students can contact EOP for a variety of academic support services and courses and EOP also works closely with the following programs:

Disability Access Services

Student study groups for biology, biochemistry, chemistry, physiology, statistics and others

Sigma Delta Omega (SDO) Women's Science Sorority Study Groups

SDO members facilitate study groups for courses in biology, biochemistry, chemistry, anatomy and physiology, statistics and others. Tutoring and other Academic Support Services by Subject

Biology

The Biology department graduate teaching assistants offer open office hours for general biology courses (BI 211, 212, 213) in The Valley Library's Collaborative Learning Center <http://osulibrary.oregonstate.edu/clc/>.

Chemistry

- Free, drop-in tutoring for general chemistry (CH 121, 122, 123, 221, 222, 223) is offered at the Mole Hole in the Library's Collaborative Learning Center. See schedule at <http://chemistry.oregonstate.edu/courses/molehole.html>.
- Tutors for other chemistry courses (or individual tutors for general chemistry) can be hired. The Chemistry Department keeps a list of qualified tutors in Gilbert 153.

Mathematics

- Free, drop in tutoring is available in the Math Learning Center in Kidder 108. Math tutors are also available evenings in the Library's Collaborative Learning Center. See information at <http://www.math.oregonstate.edu/?q=mlc>.
- Small group learning opportunities are available in the MATH EXCEL workshops where motivated students work together cooperatively on challenging problems and earn credit. Students in MTH 111 and 112 take MTH 199 and students in 251 and 252 take MTH 299. Contact the Educational Opportunities Program (other side of handout) OR Tom Dick in Math (737-1570, tpdick@math.orst.edu) depending on who the courses is listed with.
- The Academic Success Center offers small (5-6) tutor facilitated study groups for MTH 111 and 112 courses where students work on core concepts of the course. Contact the Academic Success Center at (541) 737-2272 for information.
- Students who place in MTH 065 or 095 can choose to take 102 and 103 which provide extra assistance to students and also count toward college credit. MTH 102 and 103 sections offered by the Math Department (737-4686 or 368 Kidder Hall) can be registered for online. The Educational Opportunities Program (other side of handout) also offers sections of MTH 102 and 103 for their students which students need EOP permission to register.

Microbiology

Physics
